# **Stakeholder Feedback Themes**

#### **Data Needs Themes:**

- Increase publicly available data
- Increase access to more granular data
  - $\circ$  Longitudinal data
  - Demographic (race/ethnicity, gender, age) & geographic (region, local workforce development board, school districts, county, legislative districts) breakouts
- Collect and report clean, reliable, and timely data
- Collect meaningful and relevant data
- Connect agencies' data systems
- Increase staff data skills and use
- Increase alignment to ensure measures are comparable
- Improve data systems

### **Data Use Themes:**

- Program improvement
- Policy recommendations
- Resource allocation
- Identification of need and gaps

# **Texas Early Learning Strategic Plan**

**Vision:** All Texas children are ready for school and ready to learn.

**Goal 1:** Early childhood programs in Texas are aligned to ensure children are ready to learn by kindergarten.

**Goal 2:** All families have access to a variety of high-quality programs and the information needed to discern which programs are the best fit for their child.

**Goal 3:** Families are equipped with knowledge and tools they need to be their child's primary caregiver.

**Goal 4:** Early childhood professionals are well-qualified and have access to the supports and training needed to improve kindergarten readiness and the resources to ensure they have a successful career serving children.

**Goal 5:** Each community has a plan for a coordinated system of early childhood services.

**Goal 6:** Texas has strong coordination across its early childhood system and the underlying data system to support a high degree of collaboration.

# **Draft Policy Questions**

#### Foundational Policy Question\*

1. <u>Program participation / gaps</u>: Which children and families in need, are/are not being served by early childhood services and programs?

#### Additional Policy Questions to Prioritize\*

2. <u>Program quality</u>: Which characteristics of various early childhood programs are associated with positive outcomes for which children?

3. <u>Teacher qualifications</u>: What policies and investments lead to a skilled, stable and effective early care and education workforce?

4. <u>Return on investment</u>: What are the educational and economic returns on early childhood investments?

5. <u>Program improvement/quality</u>: Is the quality of the state's early care and education programs improving longitudinally?

- 6. <u>School readiness</u>: Are the state's children, starting at birth, on track to succeed?
- 7. <u>Access/child health outcomes</u>: Do families have access to the resources they need to raise healthy children?
